Synthesis Partnership

In 2012, CPA Australia commissioned two synthesis papers on auditor independence and audit market structure to aid in the dissemination of research findings for policy setting and regulation. These are now published in Australian Accounting Review.

In 2014, we called for AASIG members to express their interest in participating in a further round of projects on going concern reporting (Elizabeth Carson, Neil Fargher, Yuyu Zhang) and professional scepticism (Noel Harding, Radzi Jidin). These are also now forthcoming in Australian Accounting Review.
