

Patricia Dechow is a Professor of Accounting at the Marshall School of Business at University of Southern California. Her research interests are the nature and purpose of accounting accruals, evaluating the quality and reliability of earnings and the informativeness of earnings to capital markets, the use of earnings information in predicting stock returns, the use of round numbers as goals and the effect of analysts' forecasts on investor perceptions of firm value.

Martin Messner is Professor of Management Control and Associate Dean of Studies at the University of Innsbruck, Austria. Martin is primarily interested in contemporary practices of management accounting and control, which he examines mostly by means of field research. He has worked, among other topics, on the implementation of performance measurement systems, on the relationship between financial and strategic objectives in new product development and on the possibilities and limits of accountability.
