To remain future focused, Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand undertook comprehensive research into the future of the profession and the skills required to succeed within it.

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


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Developing job ready graduates

The program is about developing future ready graduates while providing flexibility and choice.



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
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The new CA Program co-design process

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Key Curriculum Changes

- **Relevant content to meet industry needs**: Subjects will focus on topics such as Risk, Ethics, Governance and Technology.
- Embedded Professional Skills across the entire program: Focussing on the capabilities required for future success, the new CA Program will offer real world engagement, authentic simulations and challenges taught in context.
- Electives created to improve learning relevance and choice: Providing increased candidate choice, the program will include Specialty Assurance, Taxation and Financial Reporting content as electives. Additional content has also been added for data analytics and insights, strategy and performance and financial modelling.
- Content covered at university treated as assumed knowledge: Allowing a focus on content to improve upon candidates existing knowledge, freeing up space to develop high value technical and professional skills.

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

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What does the New CA Program look like?





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The Subject Timetable

The CA subject timetable includes four study terms per year, with subjects slightly staggered to vary the assessment periods.

- Core 1: Ethics and Business is offered at the beginning of each term, with an additional offering in term 4 (five times per year).
- Core 7: ICAP is offered every term.
- Core subjects 2–6 are offered two-four times per year.
- Tax and Advanced Tax has two versions running concurrently, one for candidates sitting in Australia and one for those in New Zealand.
- Electives are offered based on demand.

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
Assessing Professional Skills in CA X Rubrics

Allocating marks and grades to professional skills requires markers to make judgement about the quality of the work.

Rubrics make explicit the <u>criteria to be used</u> and the <u>standards</u> <u>associated with different levels of performance</u>

Advantages of effective rubrics

- Assure constructive alignment of the assessment task with the Subject Learning Outcomes
- Clearly and unambiguously convey assessment requirements
- Ensure markers award marks and grades consistently / reliably
- Provide clear and unambiguous feedback





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Updated CA Foundations

Partnered with Deakin University to offer a refreshed CA Foundations entry pathway:

- 13 online learning units mapped against pre-requisite knowledge for the core CA Program subjects
- Enrolment on demand any unit at any time
- Six exam periods per year
- Dedicated CA Foundations units in both New Zealand and Australian Taxation and Business Law
- Studies completed 100% online with engaging learning materials supported by activities and diagnostic selfassessment tools which help to assess topic understanding

All new CA Program candidates have access to the CA Foundations content as an assumed knowledge refresher.

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
