Jac Birt is Director of Academic Programmes and Professor of Accounting at University of Western Australia Business School. Jac's research is predominantly in international accounting and accounting education. She has published in areas such as segment reporting, XRFI, ICT skills, international student learning and blended learning. Jac is AFAANZ President Elect (Australia) and the AFAANZ representative on the International Accounting Education Standards Board (IAESB). She is also the AFAANZ Board Director responsible for Education.

Dr David Bond is a Senior Lecturer at University of Technology Sydney. Since 2012 he has been a regular guest on ZSER, including covering four Federal Budgets. David has an active interest in the role of integrating technology and social media in the learning environment.
